

Recycling and waste over the festive period

The day of the week your recycling and waste is collected will change over the Christmas period.

Red = earlier collection Blue = later collection Black = no change to collections These changes start Saturday 18 December 2021 and end on Saturday 8 January 2022. Collections will return to normal from Monday 10 January 2022.



In the event of disruption to waste collections

If we are unable to collect your waste – e.g. due to severe bad weather, please:

Leave your refuse bin out. If we can't get to you on your scheduled collection day, we'll come back and collect it as soon as we can when it is safe to do so. Take your garden waste bin back in and put it out on your next scheduled garden waste collection day.

Leave your recycling blue bags and your recycling boxes out (as long as they don't present a trip hazard). We'll collect them as soon as we can when it is safe to do so.

HRCs are open 9am-5pm every day -

they are only closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.















Every year, we throw away 7.2 million tonnes of food and drink. This could be costing your household a whopping £720 a year!

To help reduce your waste - buy only what food you need, perhaps make a shopping list, and buy things with less packaging on them. Around 650 pieces of junk mail are posted through your door every year.

Reuse butter tubs for storage containers, and plastic bottles to refill with water.

Make tea light holders with glass jars, paint them to make home made gifts.

Cut up used Christmas cards to make gift tags. Take your old books, toys, clothes and games to a local charity shop so they can find new homes.



RECYCLE

Recycling doesn't just reduce waste, it is also a planet-friendly way to make new things. Like turning plastic bottles into t-shirts, fleece jackets, sleeping bags or even carpets.

Did you know that your recycling can take as little as 12 weeks to be turned into something new?

If it can't be recycled, we can turn it into energy.

At our Shropshire Energy Recovery Facility we take 65,000 tonnes of your rubbish every year and turn it into electricity to power 10.000 homes.

Once your rubbish is burnt, the ash that is left over is recycled to make roads. Any metal, is recovered and recycled. All gases are treated inside the facility.

Nothing goes to waste!
